CELEBRATION OF THE GOLDEN JUBILEE OF

BRO. BERNARD GUESDON

n Sunday, July 25th, 2021, the Community of the General House celebrated with fervour the Golden Jubilee of the Perpetual Profession of Bro. Bernard Guesdon. A solemn celebration of the Eucharist, a video recalling of the apostolic journey of the life of Bro. Bernard, a song in homage to the jubilarian, a message of gratitude to the Archivist, well versed in his task, and a festive meal marked this celebration. At the end of the day, after expressing his thanks to the Superior General, the Brothers of the Community and the Sisters of St. Joseph of Kottayam, Bro. Bernard Guesdon, with palpable emotion, let the following words flow from his heart.

JUBILEE! ... for the gift of Joseph, my father, a hard-working agricultural labourer, and Juliette, my mother, so joyful, and who gave me the love of singing. They did not hesitate to allow their first-born to live his vocation as a Brother of St. Gabriel. Jubilee also for the gift of my younger brothers, Robert and Jean-Paul. JUBILEE! ... for being baptized in the Parish of Saint-Pierre de Mouchamps.

JUBILEE! ... for the gift of having lived as a neighbour with the Protestant Families during my entire childhood, as the Calvinists have been present in my home town for almost five Centuries (1st Temple built in 1628). This opened me up to tolerance and respect.

JUBILEE! ... for having lived my childhood in



a Montfortian and Gabrielite atmosphere, because I was educated by the Sisters of Saint-Gildas des Bois and the Brothers of Saint-Gabriel: Father Gabriel Deshayes sent the Brothers in 1835 and the Sisters in 1838. They



remained in my Parish for more than 150 years. Thank you, Bro. René Dabin and Sr. Jean-Baptiste!

JUBILEE! ... for the Formation I received in the Juniorates of La Tremblaie and Saint-Laurent, in the Novitiate of Bois-Tissandeau, which led me to my Profession on September 1st, 1964, after which I continued in the Scholasticate of La Mothe-Achard.

JUBILEE! ... for my first two years of teaching at Le Boupère in Vendée, under the guidance of the two wise and joyful Confreres: Bros. Jules Renaudin and Édouard Hélias. It was a precious initiation at the community, pedagogical and parish Levels.

JUBILEE! ... for the 28 years lived in Senegal and the 2 Years in Congo-Brazzaville: Years of openness to other Cultures and Religions, especially to Islam. My thanks to the Presidents Léopold Sédar Senghor and Abdou Diouf, who provided dignity and openness to their Country. Many thanks to my French, Senegalese and Congolese Brothers, to the Juniors and Novices, to my Christian and Muslim Colleagues and Students. Thanks for the joy of having seen the District of Senegal become a Province in 1983.

JUBILEE! ... for the two sabbatical years I spent in Fribourg, Switzerland, in 1983-1985, at Ecole de la Foi, founded by Father Jacques Loew: Years that allowed me to really open up to the Bible, to the Liturgy, to the Theology, to

the History of the Church, to Community Life, with Religious Brothers and Laity from every corner of the World.

JUBILEE! ... for the 22 years lived here in Rome, in the "heart" of Italy, of the Catholic Church, of the Congregation of the Brothers of St. Gabriel, of the Montfortian Family! Thanks to Italy, the 5th Land of adoption!

Many Thanks to all my Brothers and Sisters of the Casa Generalizia, to our dear Chaplains, to our dear Collaborators. Thanks to the Brother Capitulants and Session Members. Thanks to the Montfortian Fathers and Brothers, to the Brothers of St. Gabriel, to the Daughters of Wisdom, who vibrate the hearts of Montfort, of Marie-Louise and Gabriel Deshayes. The Vicar of La Cornuaille (Anjou) wrote on 19 March 1764 in the Parish Register: "The mission was opened by Messieurs de Saint-Laurent, worthy successors of Messieurs de Montfort and Mulot, Messieurs Albert, Haquet, Javelot and Renaud, and Brother Guérin, catechist". These are not just names, they are really elder brothers and sisters who participate in our life today, who built it. We can sing with Saint Louis-Marie: "Let us bless the Lord forever for his goodness! Let us bless the Lord forever for his goodness!"

N SALE: The different departures to the Father's house, the reorganization of the quarries especially at the 3rd age make the Province try to reduce the places of implantation and to fill the houses that remain. In 2018-2019, 37 brothers lived in 7

residences; 11 of them were in infirmary at the Residence de la Salle run by the FÉC. In 2019-2020, the number of houses is similar but the Brothers are 35 in number, plus two Brothers in Intercultural Community; in the infirmary, there are 10 confreres. The pandemic occured and in 2020-2021, there are only 32 Brothers, including two from the Intercultural Community. However, only 6 brothers are in the infirmary.

In 2021-2022, we reorganize a little: the chalet of Ste Geneviève is sold, the residence of Saint-Bruno is also sold and that of Trois-Rivières is put up for sale.

REUNION: Will we recognize each other after 18 months? It is this desire to see us again following the relief from Public Health about meetings, after the two doses of vaccines and the vaccination passport, that led to a REUNION party, on September 7th, 2021, on

the grounds of the Provincial House. It was strong windy and the temperature was cool. After two moves of the chairs and tables, 25 confreres came to share their joy, the tributes to the Jubilees, the Marian prayer and the meal. We celebrated the 25 years of perpetual



profession of Brothers Jocelin Dussault and Jean-Claude Musema (one year late), the 50 years of priesthood of Brother Guy St-Onge... we hope to continue this with his family during 2022, the 60 years of First Profession of Brothers André Contant and Gérard Joly the 60 years of second profession of Brothers Gilbert Goulet and Denis Lefebvre, the 70 years of profession of Brothers Guy St-Onge and Henri-Paul Germain, the birthdays of Denis Lefebvre (80 years), Hubert Forest (90 years) and Henri-Paul Germain (90 years). ACTIVITIES: Our average age, our state of health, means that many of us are no longer on the road, walking the various fields of apostolate. Curiously, however, many confreres, even with fragile health, are members of the Community, Diocesan or Extra-Community Board of Directors, in non-profit organizations. The parishes also call on

confreres for liturgical service, the council of Fabrique, animation or catechesis in the journeys of faith. Many, and there are many, exercise an occasional and even fairly regular apostolate near the elderly, the sick, prisoners; the pandemic has often reduced this to phone calls but how warm. Finally, a few others are engaged in religious periodicals of all kinds. (En son Nom, Les nôtres...)



The event had to be organized taking into account the restrictions due to Covid-19. Unfortunately, due to the circumstances, we could invite Brothers only. For sure, we would have been very happy to have the very appreciated and precious presence of the Members of the Families of our Martyrs, as well as many other friends of the Institution.

This drawback was partially compensated by the presence of Bro. John Kallarackal, Superior General, and Bro. Jean-Paul Mbengue, Assistant General. Both had come from Rome to spend a few days and take some rest among the Brothers of the Province of Spain. Their presence added solemnity to the homage and strength to our prayers.

We also had the joy of being accompanied by Fr. Jesús Espeja, O.P., who had preached the Retreat to the Brothers during the previous week. Fr. Jesús would have been pleased and happy to be present with us but on the same day the Church was celebrating the Feast of the Founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominican Order): Saint Dominic of Guzmán.

The celebration started in the Chapel of the




Community where Bro. Faustino Besa, the Provincial Superior, presented the event we were commemorating. Bro. John Kallarackal addressed an official message to those who were present.

The moving ceremony came to an end with a prayer of homage and supplication to our "Martyrs" and a hymn to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

he first Session of the Provincial Chapter 2019-2022 was held in Angers from June 23th to 25th, 2021. The Assembly was made up of 18 Capitulants and invited Members: Bros. Dionigi TAFFARELLO, Vicar General, T.K. James, Assistant General, Louis ANTHONYSAMY, Communication in charge, Dionisio SANTORO, Superior of the Italian Sector and Marcel ULENAERS, Superior of the Sector of Belgium. Bro. Thierry BEAUPLET (a Brother of the Christian Instruction of Ploërmel) was the Facilitator.

Bro. Claude MARSAUD, Provincial Superior, opened the first Session explaining that the main objective of the Chapter was to prepare the Province of France for July 1st, 2022 that will see a new Provincial Administration, a new organization and, therefore, a new structure: "For that, we need to fully grasp all the realities that influence the future of our Province and take into account our human resources, the necessary solidarity with the other Provinces and with the whole Congregation, to be able to consider with hope and cohesion the future and the mission."

Bro. Dionigi TAFFARELLO, Vicar General, conveyed the warm greetings of Bro. John KALLARACKAL, the Superior General. He, then, stressed upon the importance of this Session of the Provincial Chapter because it was "... a time to prepare for the future, to develop projects and programs. This Chapter takes on a special character because we are called to project ourselves into an even more distant future... We are invited to reflect upon and take important orientations that are not easy at all. Therefore, I would like to invite each one of us to adopt a positive mindset which seems essential to me for the success of the Provincial Chapter. The first invitation is to open our hearts and minds to the Holy Spirit... and the second invitation is to embrace the future with hope."





During this Session, in addition to the work on the restructuring of the Province, a financial report of the Province was presented to the Capitulants who were also informed about the work of the Committee in charge of the dossier "Montfortian Action for a Sustainable Integral Development (AMDID)". One evening was also spent to raising awareness about the necessary reparation towards the victims of sexual abuse in the Church.

The Province of France is currently made up of 5 entities: Madagascar, Brazil, Italy, Belgium and France. At the end of the Session, the Provincial Chapter proposed to the Central Administration the study and the establishment of a new structure. It also stressed upon the fact that each entity should be consulted in the coming months about the restructuring project.

he Chapter came to an end with Bro. T. K. James' concluding words: "I am quite Timpressed by the way the Chapter went off. Even if the Province is facing a difficult situation, the Members of the Provincial Chapter have shown their courage to move forward with hope and trust in God. I was very happy to observe the cordial atmosphere and the fraternal spirit among you. We believe that 'with God everything is possible' (Mt 19:26). I would like to conclude by thanking God for the generosity of all the Brothers of the Province of France... Let us put the future of this Province in God's hands and His Divine Will."

More than two hundred packets of cooked meals were distributed to the disadvantaged people on daily basis. MCDS believes in Divine Providence and support started pouring in from the Province of Bengaluru, National Council of Montfort Brothers, Friends and well-wishers of MCDS and we started the relief operation with dry Rations consisting of rice, dal, oil and other essentials for about 1500 families. Most of our beneficiaries were

ASSUMPTION UNIVERSITY BUSINESS MAJOR STUDENTS WIN THE GOLD STANDARD PRIZE



them along with two other NGOs to train and supervise the teachers of selected Government schools in imparting inclusive education. The Province of Northeast India has signed an MoU to this effect through the Heads of Montfort School, Champaknagar and Montfort School, Agartala to train the teachers of 80 schools in Inclusive Education. The Government of Tripura will finance the total expense incurred in the implementation of this project. In accordance with the MoU signed, the Montfort Brothers along with other NGOs have taken the responsibility of providing the Government with special educators and Mentors to implement this project.

BUILDING BACK BETTER COVID - 19 RESPONSE IN NORTHEAST

he Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel, Province of Northeast India, in response to the worsening Covid-19 situation in the Northeast region during the 2nd Wave, decided to plan a reach out programme to alleviate the suffering of the marginalized, under privileged and the disabled.

The Brothers in collaboration with CBM Germany, distributed dry rations, hygiene kits and electronic tablets, through Montfort Centre for Education- Tura, Meghalaya, Montfort

School- Guwahati, Assam Montfort School-Agartala and Montfort Hr. Sec. School-Champaknagar in the state of Tripura as part of a Project 'Building Back Better – Covid – 19 Response'. This initiative brought relief and consolation to 2735 marginalized and underprivileged families inclusive of 529 Children/People with disabilities and a hundred students who were presented with the electronic equipment to enable them to attend their online classes.

Social Action Centre at Ayan Poruvai, Palakurichy carried out a special program for women. Free goats were distributed to sustain their families and it is a means of generating revenue for them. Tuition centers for village school going children were once again opened and children regularly come to these centers for their educational learning programs.

Our Juniors are back into our Juniorate after a gap of almost two years. Our Brothers were in touch with them constantly. We have 38 candidates. Our recruiting process had a setback due to pandemic and lockdown. I hope and pray the situation will be normal in course of time.

THE PARTICIPATION OF MONTFORTIAN ASSOCIATES MOVEMENT IN THE MONTFORTIAN MISSION

That content of spiritual and missionary training can open the associate's vision to the spirit of communion and synodality among the Montfortian Family?

All our associates are to have done their preparation for total consecration before enrolling themselves into the movement. Our mission as Montfortian Associates is to live, share and promote the charism and spirituality of the total consecration according to St. Louis Marie de Montfort.

We provide a monthly formation which is an ongoing training to deepen the associate's understanding and appreciation on the life and writings of Montfort. Throughout the year, there are community building opportunities such as fellowship, Eucharist and workshops to help members build bonds and find a sense of connectedness as a community. Our associates are also engaged in some forms of outreach through events such as parish missions and the Heart of Living seminar where they get to promote the spirituality and importance of the total consecration to Jesus through Mary.

What is the formation of reliable leaders with good knowledge and appreciation in the field of Montfortian spirituality in order to be authentic missionaries in schools, parishes, dioceses, communities?

Montfortian resources, which include the life and writings of Montfort as well as the reflections and retreat materials are made available at Montfort Centre. Our associates also have a dedicated partnership room for their use and a resource space to call their own.

We run the Montfortian Experience programme which are retreat sessions based on the spirituality and writings of Montfort. The programme helps participants to renew their commitment to God and deepen their lived experience of a total consecration. We have even managed to run an online Montfortian Experience on the Secret of Mary in May 2020 as well as a blended approach on Prayer for Missionaries (Extraordinary Mission) in September 2020.

Before the Covid-19 pandemic, we would organize a Pilgrimage in the Footsteps of



Montfort every two to three years. We have installed sites of Montfort in each of our institutions and will be running a local pilgrimage using a blended approach called the "Montfortian Pilgrimage In Our Schools" (MPIOS) for our school community, associates and eventually the wider church community.

The possible missionary fields for collaboration:

- 1. Montfortian Spirituality & Retreat Work
 The Montfortian programs at Montfort
 Centre are run by the Montfortian
 Associates. The pastoral program staff
 themselves are also Montfortian
 Associates.
- 2. Educative Mission of the Brothers
 Some of our associates are teachers in the institutions of the Brothers while others are involved in the social mission such as Boys' Town. They help to live and share the spirituality of the total consecration in their engagement with their colleagues and beneficiaries.
- 3. School Chaplaincy Team
 Our associates are also in the Montfortian
 School Chaplaincy Team. This team is the
 keeper of the Catholic character of the
 institutions, and integrates Montfortian
 values into the life of the school through
 retreats, dissemination of materials and
 group activities for the whole school
 community.

The history of the creation of the Montfortian Associates in connection with Montfort Center in Singapore: are there any other groups animated by the Brothers of saint Gabriel in Singapore-Malaysia, what kind of formation and missionary activities are offered in Singapore, what are the challenges experienced?

The 30th and 31st General Chapters of the Montfort Brothers of St Gabriel had called for empowering the laity as collaborators and partners. Establishing the Associates of the Brothers of St Gabriel under the name "Montfortian Associates Movement" (MAM). The Montfortian Associates Movement for the then Province of Malaysia-Singapore was officially launched by Bro Yvan Passebon, Vicar General of the Montfort Brothers of St Gabriel on 21 Jan 2015 at Montfort Centre. The first 13 members began their preparation in October 2015 and Pronounced their total consecration on 3 April 2016. The other group animated by the Brothers includes the Montfortian Associates in Sabah, Malaysia.

The membership for the associates is very diverse with members even from the Philippines and Indonesia. We have a total of 42 members to date with the youngest being 23 years old and the oldest being 78 years old.

One of the challenges is finding time for the preparation process which should be 33 days as proposed by Montfort. Lay people who have family and work commitments are unable to set apart a whole month. Inspired by St. Ignatius' 19th annotation, we spaced out the preparation across a period of 9 months on every alternate Saturday morning of the month. We even did an online preparation for 15 participants through Zoom due to the Covid-19 restrictions.

Another challenge would be language as some of our members' native language is not English. Some are more comfortable using Bahasa Indonesia and Chinese. Not all the writings of Montfort are available in the languages. For instance, only the Secret of Mary and True Devotion are available in Chinese.

Crafting Knotted Rosaries

n Saturday 1st May, we held our 2nd MA Community Building Day for 2021. As the month of May is the month of Mary, a rosary making session was planned for our community building followed by mass to bless the rosary and to commission Montfortian Associates to spread devotion to our Lady and recitation of the Holy Rosary.

We had about 20 participants and everyone arrived at about 9 am to have breakfast. There was indeed no shortage of food as many people brought something to share. We even had some piping hot Chinese dim sum with home sourced chili sauce.

Brother Damian started the rosary making session by showing us certain videos on rosary making.

Thankfully, he then declared that he had a simpler method and showed us how to make the knots that would resemble our rosary beads. He, however, cautioned that we must always maintain the distance between the knots. Bro Damian was deft with his hands and his knots came out beautifully consistent. Those of us following his guided instructions soon fell behind as we had to unpick our knots and re-knot again, not once but quite a few times.

Once all ten knots were complete, Bro Damian showed us how to make the crucifix using a similar knot technique. It was then that the scales fell from our eyes. We realized maintaining the same distance between the knots would leave us enough rope to make the knots for the crucifix! We were tasked to make two rosaries but quite a few of us only managed to complete one. We however promised ourselves we would make a second rosary and took some extra rope home. The rosary making session ended with all handcrafted rosaries collected and placed in an organza bag with our names for the blessing and

commissioning ceremony that would take place at mass.

Fr. Edward Seah presided at mass and as May 1st was also the Feast of St Joseph the Worker, he commemorated St Joseph as the exemplar of a man whose sanctification comes from working for the glory of God. After holy communion, Fr. Seah blessed all the handmade rosaries. Zerah, the President of Montfortian Associate then called out our names individually. We came forward to receive our blessed handmade rosary which Zerah commissioned each of us with the words "let us crown ourselves"; to which we each responded, "with the roses of the rosary".

It was an uplifting moment as we prayed after the commissioning for the graces of the Mysteries of the life and passion of our Lord to come down into our souls and into the souls of those we touch. With this all of us were sent to spread devotion to our Lady and the Holy Rosary.

Immediately after mass, we adjourned for a spicy curry lunch and a carrot cake dessert donated by one of the participants at our Evening of Prayer with Montfort. n Saturday, June 12th, the third online meeting of Formation for Shared Mission took place. On this occasion,



in response to the request expressed at the previous meeting, all the members were invited to the same link:
Brothers,

associates and collaborators fro

associates and collaborators from all over the Province.

Given that this year marks the fifth anniversary of Laudato si' on care for our common home, the GCM Formation Team felt that it would be an interesting theme for all of us, as individuals and educators, for our final meeting.

It is certainly impossible to deal with a subject like this in a single session, but at the very least we are trying to give a condensed presentation of its content and to raise awareness of the urgency of the challenge we face in "caring for our common home". Because, as Jaume Flaquer, Head of the Theological Area of Christianity and Justice, says in his article "Coronavirus: a single humanity, a common vulnerability", the pandemic situation, which we are still experiencing, has opened our eyes to

a reality that we thought was far away. A reality that has highlighted the deterioration of nature and how this affects the poorest in particular.



Pope Francis tells us that an integral conversion is necessary, a commitment to another way of life. And that this is possible because human beings are capable of overcoming and regenerating themselves, beyond all the mental and social conditioning imposed on them.

And especially Christians, because this conversion is born in us from the convictions of our

faith.

What are the keys to change proposed by "Laudato Si""?

- 1. Be grateful and practice gratuitousness: The Pope asks every Christian to recognize the world (creation) "as a gift received from the Father's love", something that implies "attitudes of renunciation and generous gestures".
- 2. Educate in different areas: at school, in the media, in catechesis and, above all, in the family.
- 3. Banish compulsive consumerism: human beings accept lifestyles imposed by planning and mass-produced products and act with the feeling that this is the right thing to do. We believe we are free because we have a supposed freedom to consume, when those who have this freedom are a minority who hold economic and financial power.
- 4. Forgetting selfishness: "The emptier a person's heart is, the more he or she needs objects to buy, possess and consume". It is necessary to "reach out to others" and overcome "individualism".
- 5. Inner conversion: It is necessary "to be converted, to really meet Jesus Christ and to start a new life. The Christian must live his vocation by admiring the beauty of God's work and protecting it. To have "a healthy relationship with creation" as part of the

conversion of the whole person. Change from within.

After the presentation of the contents of the encyclical, we worked in groups in different online rooms and finally we shared the different reflections in the main room, where we discussed the need to dedicate more time to the study of the encyclical given its richness and depth. For all, believers and non-believers, the encyclical is a guide to achieve the much-

needed integral conversion.

With the hope that next year we will be able to return to a longed-for normality that will allow us to meet in person, we wish each other a good and well-deserved summer break.

- And of course, the tercentenary of the arrival of Marie-Louise of Jesus in Saint Laurent sur Sèvre. A turning point for the Daughters of Wisdom and for the whole Montfortian Family.

At what three points did we stop?

HER MEETING WITH FATHER DE MONTFORT,1701 AND HER ADMISSION TO THE GENERAL HOSPITAL OF POITIERS,1703.





When Louis Grignion de Montfort came to Poitiers for the first time, Marie-Louise was 17 years old. This encounter of grace was decisive for Marie-Louise, who chose the direction of that priest and remained faithful to him at the cost of innumerable difficulties. Marie-Louise continually insisted on obtaining entrance to a convent from her director. The answer was always vague: "Yes, you will be a religious", without any further explanation, and without revealing anything of the project he had in mind for her. One day, Marie-Louise returned to the charge with particular eagerness. The priest replied: "Good, come and live in the hospital!" She joined the small group of "La Sagesse" formed by Montfort, who made her take the habit of dressing of the poor. She stayed there for ten years and lived the "God alone" dear to Louis-Marie. Active, silent, giving herself entirely to the poor and abandoned.

MARIE-LOUISE LEAVES POITIERS FOR LA ROCHELLE, 1715






After ten years, Marie-Louise received a letter from Father de Montfort asking her to leave Poitiers for La Rochelle. With Sister Catherine Brunet, she arrived in La Rochelle to teach the children. Marie-Louise consecrated there her qualities of tranquility, gentleness and psychology. Soon, the classes successfully welcomed the poor children.



What to do after the death of the spiritual guide? As a disciple of Montfort, she trusted in Providence. She expected a sign from Providence. She went to pray to Mary, Queen of Hearts, in the little chapel at Montbernage. The sign came in the form of a meeting with Jacques Goudeau, to whom Montfort had entrusted the daily prayer. He pointed out Saint Laurent, where Montfort's tomb was located. Madame de Bouillé offered Marie-Louise an empty house, the "Maison Longue". For several years they lived in conditions of extreme poverty, but by this bold gesture, Marie-Louise de Jesus is at the origin of the foundation of the cradle of the three Montfortian Institutes.

The meeting was attended by 27 people from the area of Catalonia and about 30 from the area of Madrid and La Aguilera. As always, the dialogue established between the participants enriched us all, although we concluded that it is necessary to widen the information on Marie-Louise of Jesus, for all that she can contribute to us and for the importance she had for the whole Montfortian Family. Therefore, when we are able to hold a more extensive session in person, we will do so.

THE 49 BROTHERS OF SAINT GABRIEL AND THEIR CHAPLAIN

MARTYRS OF THE RELIGIOUS PERSECUTION DURING THE CIVIL WAR OF SPAIN IN 1936

MARTYRDOM Common narration of the 39 Brothers and the Chaplain detained in Can Valls, (Provincial and Formation House) in San Vicente de Montalt - Caldetas

Barcelona

n the last days of October, the members of the San Vicente de Montalt union, plotted along with the controlling patrols, the assault on the convent of the Brothers of Saint Gabriel, because "there continued the teaching of religious studies to the students, which could no longer be allowed..." with the intention of jailing them and eventually to martyrize them. Therefore on the 7th of November of 1936. around noon, some 150 members of the controlling patrols and other Marxists, surrounded the house and took it by force. Immediately the Brothers were detained, and using force and death threats, they were forced to remain standing next to the Torre del Moro of the house until 4:30 in the afternoon. Meanwhile, a substantial group of anarchists began to vandalize and pillage the house.

All the students younger than 18 -some 70-were rounded up in the dining hall and were given their first revolutionary and Marxist "speech" which was atheist in nature.

Around five in the afternoon, they lined up the 44 Brothers and the Chaplain in rows by pairs and under heavy guard were taken to the buses that awaited in the main road to Barcelona, in the neighborhood of Las Ánimas, some 400 meters from the house, where various citizens of Las Animas saw them, as they soon after attested before the Judge.

They were forced to climb in right away and began the journey to Barcelona where they arrived when it was already dark, around seven in the evening. The convoy halted at the doors of the former convent of the religious sisters of Jerusalem, now converted into the secret police

headquarters of San Elias, sadly know for the cruelty experienced there, where numerous religious persons, priests and good men were martyrized.

They were placed in a small room. There were obligated to remain 39 Spanish Brothers, 5 French Brothers and the Chaplain Father. According to the testimony of Brother Gabriel Perboyre, "the food they were given was sufficient and the manner among the imprisoned was very reserved". The detainees were greatly resigned with the probable tragic end before them.

Free moments, that constituted the greater part of the day, were dedicated to prayer, the prayer of the Rosary, and commenting on their situation. The presence of the Chaplain Father and that of the Provincial Brother, Brother Estanislao, were of great support in helping maintain the strength of the spirit.

The five French Brothers, among them Brother Gabriel Perboyre, were liberated thanks to the intervention of the French Consul of Barcelona, after they had been held in prison 48 hours with the general group.

Around the 12th of November, about 11:30 at night, as was customary in the San Elías prison, a group of armed militia, after handcuffing the Brothers in pairs, forced them to climb into a truck, taking them to the entrance of the Montcada cemetery. Upon the prearranged signal they fired numerous times and the Brothers began to fall covered in their own blood.

young and able religious person with a somewhat impulsive character Brothers Bonifacio and Bautista, citizens of his village, had an influence on his education through the example they gave. He dedicated numerous years to teaching in various Gabrielite schools such as Arenys de Mar, Bañolas, San Sadurní de Noya and Valls. The quality of his person is apparent through his professional enthusiasm and for his Catechism classes in collaboration with the Parish. He was very much appreciated in the various Schools where he worked by both his students and their parents.

His Director in Valls, Brother Sebastián, had the pleasure of attesting that, thanks be to God, Brother Elias had performed with great perseverance his duties both as a religious person and as a teacher.

He stood out by his delicate manners and his almost child - like features and innocent smile. Following the advice of his Director he did whatever possible to flee and reach San Vicente de Montalt (Can Valls).

He relied on his faith when facing the great danger that neared. He had no problems accepting the final sacrifice of the martyrdom in Montcada.

Andrés LOPEZ HERNANDO Brother Bonifacio , 38 years old Born in Cuevas de Juarros (Burgos)

e was the brother of the also martyred Brother Bautista. They were a joy of religious persons, always smiling, they appeared to be the happiest of men.

His friendly smile captured everyone and spread a religious optimism. He had a good spirit and was always willing and pious in response to the opinion of his Superiors.

Upon his return from military service he was named assistant to the cook and remained there until the 7^{th} of November of 1936 when he was detained by the militias along with the rest of the Brothers that were in Can Valls.

He was especially dedicated to the manual chores in the kitchen, vegetable garden, the farmhouse and laundering area.

A strict religious person and an example in his faithful observance of his vows. He was always ready to comply with the orders from the Superiors. He was the model of personal austerity, spirit of service and very careful with everything related to the keeping of the house.


Arriving at the moment of martyrdom, he generously entrusted himself to the cross of Christ to die with Him.
