18th COUNCIL OF THE INSTITUTE 4-20 OCTOBER 2021 CLOSING MESSAGE



Introduction:

Good morning, good afternoon and good evening to you all. As we come to the end of the 13 days of intense work online, as leaders of the different entities of our Congregation, participating in the 18th Council of the Institute, I feel confident to call it an "unqualified success" on more counts than one. As our Constitutions rightly put it, "*The Council of the Institute has for mission to provide, through concerted action, the common good and unity of the Institute*" (C. 185). As we look back at the days we have come together as members of the 18th Council of the Institute, it was evident that there was a sense of unity and charity among the 30 participants, despite the fact that we were coming from the different continents, born and brought up in different cultures, belonging to varied age groups and embracing different philosophies of life. I am sure that all the participants will be able to affirm, in one voice, that coming together as leaders of the Congregation, despite the limitation that online meetings entail, was truly an occasion to strengthen our bond as members of one large family, living out our fraternity and common brotherhood, and making a realistic appraisal of our life and mission, and making practical planning for the future.

Words of Appreciation:

If we can call the 18th Council of the Institute an "*unqualified success*", it is thanks to the collaborative efforts of different individuals and groups. On behalf of the whole Congregation, I wish to place on record my sincere appreciation to all those who have contributed in one way or another towards the planning, preparation and the successful completion of these sessions.

In the first place, I raise my heart in thanksgiving to God for accompanying us throughout the whole process and making it possible for us all to be present without any hassles, despite some fears that we may experience some problems with networks in certain parts of Africa. Secondly, I wish to express my sincere thanks to each member of the Central Administration for their significant contributions towards the success of this Council of the Institute, and to the 4 Moderators who did a magnificent job, with a professional touch. In fact, the remote preparation had begun way back in January 2020, because we had hoped to hold 18th Council of the Institute and other meetings on its sidelines in May 2020 in Spain, and the immediate preparation for the online sessions from June 2021. Yes, "man proposes and God disposes", or as Steven R. Cove would put it "There are certain things that are within the circle of your concern, but they are not within the circle of your control". Since a formal vote of thanks will be proposed by Bro. Dionigi, the Vicar General, at the end of the current session, I don't wish to duplicate things by enumerating the names of all those individuals and groups who made significant contributions for the success of the 18th Council of the Institute.

All the same, I wish to place on record my personal appreciation to all the leaders of the entities for the realistic presentations of your entities, and for your active and dignified participation in the discussions in the Groups and in the General Assembly, always keeping "the common good and unity of the Institute" (C 185). I was happy to see the spirit of brotherhood prevailing throughout the sessions, coupled with the sense of purpose and determination to focus on the radical renewal of its members and sustainability of all the sectors of the Congregation.

Time of Grace:

You will all agree with me that inaugurating the Council of the Institute on the Feast of St. Francis, the patron of the Religious Brothers, and whose eco-spirituality we are trying to translate into action

through the realization of the Laudato Si' Goals, was truly a time of grace. The beautifully organized Marian Prayers every day was also a gentle reminder of our Montfortian characteristic of the tender devotion of our Blessed Mother and our commitment to the recitation of the Most Holy Rosary. The 5th National Conference organized by the All India Association of Montfort Schools, during the days of the 18th Council of the Institute, being blessed with an all-time high 2300 participants online, was also a powerful testimony to "The Communitarian Dimension of the Montfortian Mission" that our 32nd General Chapter refers to.

As we listened to the reports of the different entities and that of the Central Administration, we realized that we had several reasons to thank God for as a Congregation. The efforts made by several of the Provinces to realize the 5 priorities given to us by the 32nd General Chapter, namely Sacred Fire, Formation, Mission Together, Fraternal Life and Education Mission, are truly commendable. Equally laudable are the efforts of our communities and institutions to commit ourselves to the implementation of the Laudato Si' Goals. Everyone concerned has been positive about the functioning of the International Commissions for Formation, Partnership and the Revision of the Rule of Life, mandated by the 32nd General Chapter. The reports from the Secretariats and Sub-Secretariats of Education and JPIC, the new websites launched in the domains of Partnership and JPIC, and the new Congregational Software, all have received appreciation from one and all. The analysis of the results of the Missionary Survey was truly encouraging and indicative of the desire, at least in a small section of our Congregation, to rekindle and revitalize the missionary dynamism inherent of our Congregation, and to re-commit ourselves to the orientations of starting and strengthening of International/Intercultural Communities, but which evidently needs to be nurtured, especially by the leadership of the Congregation. Similarly, commendable are the efforts made by the Restructuration Committee at the level of the Central Administration as well as at the level of the Provinces of Canada, France and Spain, towards a possible restructuration of our Western Provinces.

Planning for the Future:

Despite all these positive signs to rejoice about, we also became acutely aware "*that we Brothers are influenced by the dominant counter values of our culture which ensnare us in the dynamics of consumerism, superficiality, individualism and greed*", *the very things that we had painfully acknowledged during the 31st General Chapter* (31 GC 7). The Reports from the different Provinces repeatedly reminded us of the negative tendencies still prevalent, like the craving for power, position and possession, groupism based on different factors, religious values taking a back seat in our life and mission, inordinate and irresponsible use of the social media, lack of vocations in certain sectors of the Congregation, lack of transparency and accountability in our life and in our mission, etc.

In the backdrop of these feelings, came the Resource Persons to make us become aware of the existing realities and to remind us of the need and importance of returning to the essentials of Religious Life, and about the urgency of a transformation and conversion, as individuals, as communities, as Provinces and as a Congregation. Speaking about Transparency and Accountability in Religious Congregations, Fr. Lord Winner CMF, recalled to us the powerful statement of Pope Francis: "Internationally accepted regulations require transparency from those holding key roles in the public sector for the purpose of preventing and combatting conflicts of interests, patronage practices and corruption in general".

Fr. Luiz Stefani SMM, the Superior General of the Montfort Missionaries placed before us the icons of St. Louis Marie de Montfort, Fr. Gabriel Deshayes, the Virgin Mary, St. Paul and Jesus himself, to propel us to be dynamic missionaries as envisaged in our Rule of Life: "*Near you or in far away countries, they await your fraternal love and your help, to make them conscious of their dignity, to free them from oppression of every kind, to dispel their ignorance, to lighten their spiritual distress, to satisfy their longing for a hope of salvation*" (RL 64). The group discussions we had on revitalizing the missionary dynamism of our Congregation, have come up with some concrete and realistic proposals. Finally, Bro. Gabriel Villa-Real FMS, reminded us of our bounden duty and moral responsibility as

Religious Educators to protect the Rights of the Children and prevent any semblance of sexual abuse in our communities and institutions. He emphasized on the need for personal transformation and conversion as individuals, and has proposed 10 specific elements towards the path of Conversion: Being aware of the gravity of the situation, giving absolute priority to the victims, taking responsibility for our failures, taking an attitude of self-criticism leading to the courage to change, genuinely asking for forgiveness, facing the truth of the situation that led to abuses, prevention of possible recurrence, practicing absolute transparency in all matters, getting proper training in dealing with such situations and being proactive and creating a culture of change. He has also placed before us the minimum measures that are to be put in place towards Child Rights Protection.


Conclusion:

As I mentioned during the Inaugural Message the two principal objectives of our 18^{th} Council of the Institute are to make an assessment of the journey we have undertaken since our 32^{nd} General Chapter and to plan for the upcoming years leading to the 33^{rd} General Chapter. Let us pray and hope that the theme of our 32^{nd} General Chapter, "Fraternal Living and the Communitarian Dimension of the Montfortian Mission", will propel us to personal conversion, make our communities true witnesses of the evangelical values, help us put into practice the elements of good governance with greater transparency and accountability at all levels, make our mission truly Montfortian in character, giving our lay Associates and Collaborators their due place. Let us seek God's guidance and help in addressing the different challenges we face today in our Congregation, like the need to rekindle the missionary dynamism, strengthen the fragile *mission-ad-gentes* centres and the International/Intercultural communities, and to undertake the restructuring of the Western Provinces, "in the hope that God, in His providential care, will nurture new shoots of presence and mission" (cf. 32^{nd} GC § 6.2).

Before I conclude, let me once again thank each one of you, the members of the Central Administration, the Provincial Superiors, the District Superiors, the Interpreters, the Secretaries, the Translators and the Technicians, for your significant contributions towards the success of the 18th Council of the Institute. The message you carry to the Brothers, Associates and Collaborators from this Council of the Institute should inspire everyone concerned to live a life of greater authenticity, committing themselves to the cause of participating in the Church's mission of evangelization, witnessing and human promotion, always leading by personal example. As St. Francis of Assisi beautifully put it, "*Preach the Gospel at all times. Use words if necessary*". I wish to send you forth on your mission as animators and administers of your entities, with the last sentence in the Preamble to the Acts of the 32nd General Chapter: "We know that Mary, our Mother, St. Louis Marie de Montfort, Blessed Marie Louise of Jesus and Father Gabriel Deshayes are with us as we continue our journey, and we seek their intercession to help us transform our priorities into action."

Finally, as I mentioned in the recent Letter No. 16 from the Superior General, "*The newly appointed Postulator as well as his predecessors have been emphasizing on the fact that as a Congregation, we need to intensify our efforts towards the cause of the beatification mainly through our daily prayers and through our publications*". May our Spanish Brothers, presumed martyrs, intercede for us so that the motto of our 32nd General Chapter, "Love *with your heart and hands*", becomes a lived-out reality. Thank you and may God bless us all to be true Montfortians!

Eye Screening and Distribution of Spectacles by MCDS

Nine Hundred people benefitted during this quarter ending September 2021. Three Hundred and Twenty Five Spectacles were distributed in August and September to those with defective vision when we had the screenings by 'India Vision Institute' between July to September 2021.

Awareness on Hypertension, Diabetes and TB were organized for the General public during this reporting period and Three Hundred and Seventy Six underprivileged people in the slums and relocated slum areas of Chennai were benefitted. This programme was organized in association with "Resource Group for Education and Advocacy for Community Health" (REACH).

Commemorating the Life and Work of an Exemplary Gabrielite

n September 8, 2021. The AU Community commemorated the 72nd Anniversary of the first Religious Profession of Bro. Simeon (His Thai name is Anupatt Petchara-Yuttachai). He had his first Religious Profession on September 8, 1949 in France. In the records of the 100th Anniversary of the Brothers of St. Gabriel in Thailand, his arrival in Thailand is entered as January 4, 1957.

Some of his memorable religious and administrative achievements worth remembering are, first he is recognized as the Founder of Assumption College, Rayong where he was the



Superior and Director of ACR in 1963, and secondly, he is also recognized as the Founder of Assumption College Nakorn Ratchasima, where he served as the Superior and Director of ACN in 1967. He also worked as Professor at Assumption University of Thailand for many years until his retirement, and he was bestowed the Honor as the "Professor of the Order of St. Gabriel".

Let us imitate him in his pious devotion to Mary, our Mother and also his faithfulness to duties given to him. Let God bless him and let him enjoy good health.

Institutional Formation Plan for the collaborators of the Mission of the Brothers of Saint Gabriel



"DESHAYES, SOWER OF LIFE'



What do you want me to do for you, Lord?" This was the common link in the life of Gabriel Deshayes, tireless founder of Congregations and schools, healthcare, and social works. 200 years after his arrival in Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre, in 1821, his many heirs lived this Sunday, October 24, in the Basilica St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort a radiant day because of the fine weather and a bright one thanks to the joy that was shared. Celebration, forum with testimonies from missionaries, official launch of an Album about Gabriel Deshayes' life, before a symbolic sending off marked this meeting of memory and fully turned towards the future on the Mission World Day. The Religious and laity of 5 Congregations - Sisters of Christian Instruction of Saint-Gildas-des-Bois; Brothers of Christian Instruction - La Mennais, Ploërmel; Montfort Missionaries (Fathers and Brothers of the Company of Mary); Daughters of Wisdom and Brothers of St. Gabriel - who, altogether are present in 70 countries throughout the world, were also accompanied by members of the Association of Gabriel Deshayes' Friends and the network of pastoral care for the deaf of Morbihan and Loire-Atlantique.

"For me, I must say, Gabriel Deshayes has just been a discovery!" Many people who were present, on this Sunday October 24, often expressed their surprise. Yes, Fr. Deshayes' action in St-Laurent and for the service of the Congregations was a surprise, as well as his countless actions in favour of needy, unemployed people, prisoners, not to mention the hearing and the visually impaired. Fr. Deshayes' life did not find a large echo in the Formation Houses of the Congregations, and the studies about his life did not get a large audience.

A Brief Reminder. On January 17, 1821, Fr. Gabriel Deshayes was elected Superior General of the Montfortian Family, in Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre. During his 20 years of presence in Saint-Laurent from 1821 to 1841, he managed, developed, gave an incomparable impetus to the Fathers and Brothers of the Company of Mary known as Montfortians, to the Daughters of Wisdom and to the Brothers of St. Gabriel.

Born in Beignon (Brittany) in 1767, very early, he was interested in the context in which he lived. He would be a priest. He wanted to meet the difficulties he observed in families: the lack of work, the difficulties of raising children and the lack of spiritual life.

For 50 years, **he was a man of innovation**: launching building sites and getting involved in social activities in favour of job seekers and prisoners. He was a pioneer for the deaf. He formed batches of teachers - Religious men and women – and **founded new Congregations for them**. He **managed the patrimony** for the service of education, health care, social and spiritual projects. He **watched and listened**, carefully. And **he looked for support**, **help**, **partners**. **He made alliances against the tide** of his days and set in motion, he mobilized ...

The celebration, with the Parishioners, at the Basilica, was marked by the strong presence of Montfort Fathers, many concelebrants, several deacons, the Parish and the Pasto choirs. In his homily, Fr. Marco Pasinato, an Italian, Assistant General of the Montfort Missionaries, highlighted Fr. Deshayes compassion. Fr. Marco Pasinato, the main Celebrant. On the right François Gouthe, a deacon, in charge of the pastoral care of the deaf and hearing impaired in Morbihan. "Why did Gabriel Deshayes arrive in Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre?" We have heard about the circumstances of his arrival and even his answer: "I am going to Saint-Laurent to continue Fr. de Montfort's work", but at the origin of this affinity with Fr. de Montfort, there was a meeting with Jesus Christ, a meeting which took place on the day of his baptism, on December 6, 1767, in the church of Beignon - the very day of his birth -. This encounter echoed throughout his life the same invitation from the gospel we have just heard during today's Eucharist: "Cheer up! On your feet! He's calling you." It was a call not to give up in front of the miseries of the time, but to live the same compassion with confidence, a call which has always found in Gabriel Deshayes a passionate, generous and impressive answer!

Fr. Olivier Maire, who was killed last August, was the Postulator of the Cause of Beatification of Gabriel Deshayes. In 2018, during a two-day Seminar, Fr. Olivier had given an input about what Gabriel Deshayes had done during his stay in Saint-Laurent, from 1821 to 1841. His contribution has been used to make a video clip presented by Bro. Claude Launay and Sr. Bernadette Coche.

A GIANT OF COMPASSION

During the forum on the theme: "*What does it mean to be a missionary today and what are the challenges?*" The audience was thrilled by the excellent testimonies of Mrs. Audrey LEMARQUAND, a hearing impaired who works in a rest home and is living in Nantes, Sr Pierrette BWANBA, a Congolese, General Councillor of the Daughters of Wisdom, who is presently living in Paris, Fr. Willi SELMAN, a priest from Indonesia, member of the Montfortian Team at the Sanctuary of Pontchâteau, Bro. Michel KIENTEGA, a Brother of St. Gabriel, from Burkina Faso, student in Angers, and Mr. Eric JOYEAU, professor of philosophy at St Gabriel's Higher Secondary School, in Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre.

Each one of the speakers presented an object symbolizing the mission today, according to his point of view: a photo of a bridge, a small statue of a woman from Congo, gifts exchanged during international meetings, a photo showing exchanges of smiles between generations, a traditional Indonesian music instrument.

From their life itinerary and their personal history, the speakers shared their moving testimonies. They touched, challenged, moved. The life lived with women in Congo (DRC), in classrooms, in Burkina Faso or in Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre, the presence among young people in Indonesia or with old people in a rest home: so many different situations described by the witnesses with heart and soul and passion.

They also spoke about the help they get, the support needed to face the difficulties of their lives. Some find them in a strong relationship with God on whom you can always rely; In a prayer that gives strength; for others it is their Community life or their family life, their contacts and relationships ...

Sr Pierrette Bwanba quoted many times, a Congolese proverb which describes well according to her, the figure of Fr. Deshayes: "In a large tree come to settle and shelter thousands of birds".



e performs well in his job although the first few years he displayed some brusque behavior in class. He was responsible for his duties as a teacher. Despite his strong character, he had a serene and smiling appearance, a testament to his inner peace. He was very discret in his appraisal of controversial political subjects during the Second

He was very discreet in his appraisal of controversial political subjects during the Second Republic.

It was quite admirable to see him take advantage of the summers to work in the vegetable garden of Can Valls. He encouraged the students of the Formation House to prepare themselves with enthusiasm for their future lives as religious Gabrielite educators.

The aspiring students appreciated his friendliness, his good character and his brotherly charity. In addition he was very caring and attentive to the sick.

He was never heard to complain, even when he saw the danger that threatened the life of the religious in this Spain victim of hate and even the threat of the destruction of those religious followers.

Arriving at the moment of imprisonment, he helped to maintain the spirit of the other young men that were in the secret police headquarters of San Elias.

He taught at the schools in Valls, San Sadurní de Noya, Viladecans, Bañolas and San Vicente de Montalt (Can Valls) and was beloved by all by his students despite being so demanding.

Arriving at the 7th of November of 1936, Brother Gonzaga had to watch as his students remained at the mercy of the militias of the anarchist F.A.I. while he in the midst of insults, was driven to the jail with the rest of the Brothers.
