END OF THE YEAR RETREAT FOR THE

BROTHERS OF BRAZZAVILLE

rom 26th to 30th of December 2020, the Brothers and Pre-Novices met at the Center in Kinsoundi for their spiritual retreat. It could have been held a little earlier, but because of the corona virus pandemic, the schedule had to be changed. That retreat focused on: "The practice of the Vows in the light of the Code of Canon Law". It was preached by Father Gélase Armel Kema, professor of the Code of Canon Law at the Major Theological Seminary Cardinal Emile Biayenda and National Director of Pontifical Mission Societies (OPM). In his communication, Father Kema recalled that every religious is first of all a baptized person. Through baptism he is configured to Christ. The evangelical foundation of consecrated life is to be found in the special relationship that Jesus, during his earthly existence, had with some of his disciples, whom he invited, not only to welcome the Kingdom of God into their lives, but also to put their entire life at the service of that Kingdom, leaving everything, and closely





imitating Jesus' way of life. The religious freely undertakes to leave everything to follow Christ. And it is the Father who calls each one and sends him to imitate his Son, with the strength of the Holy Spirit. He lives in joy, which is the messianic gift par excellence, as Jesus himself promises: "so that my joy be in you and that your joy be complete". Also, thanks to Mary's charity at the wedding feast in Cana, wine brings joy. It is the same for her visitation which brought joy to the family of Zechariah. Thus, following the example of the Mother of the Savior, the religious is called to give birth to Jesus by his testimony of life. And it is faith that makes Jesus visible. And, speaking of the Vows, Father Kema pointed out that the one who takes the Vows acquires a special status. Such a consecration raises questions for others. The question of the separation of members from the Institute was also addressed by Father Kema, with reference to the appropriate canons.

ONLINE ANNUAL RETREAT

ur Constitutions ask that each Brother take a break from his usual activities for an annual retreat. In addition, the Province Directory adds a few details for proper implementation.

In the midst of the 3rd wave of the COVID-19 pandemic, squeezed into the Public Health ordinances, living in various health zones of different colours, how can we manage to fulfil such an obligation?

Last year, somewhat at the last minute, a project allowed everyone to experience, according to its environment, its personal rhythm, a moment of spiritual recovery. This year (2021), the Provincial Council had asked Brother Ronald BRISSETTE to propose different paths for the annual retreat. Some of them, like this MONTH WITH MARY from the newspaper LA-CROIX, presented documents that were difficult to reach, not very adapted to religious life. Another project: MARY IN DAILY LIFE gave too much computer research to be done, which was not helpful for a CALM prayer! Three others, well documented, would have required a long preparation in order to equip the confreres: Spiritual Retreats - Martin Hoegger; Mary, my secret | Deepening one's Faith (teachable.com); Personal recollection | Canadian Union of Ursulines (ursulinesuc.com). However, at the Provincial Council meeting, Brother René Delorme, Provincial Superior, presented a discovery! It was a 6-day






retreat based on Ignatian pedagogy: Online Retreat according to the Spiritual Exercises - La Xavière (xavieres.org).

The topics covered, day by day, include a written document (pdf) supported by audio documentation (mp4). The topics are according to Ignatian methodology (1st point, 2nd point, 3rd point) but this is hardly noticeable (heard). Everything is simple, easy to listen to, easy for personal prayer, practical, well connected to daily life, free in time because it is adapted to the individual rhythm. Two instructions per day, of 30 minutes each, a possibility of pondering over what has been presented, when one wants to. This is what was proposed to the confreres, each of whom received all the printed texts for these 6 days.

In a communiqué, each of the local communities was invited by the Provincial Superior to construct its daily schedule for the duration of at least 5 days. The only obligations were common prayers, a Marian celebration, and a community meeting. One fraternity of two Brothers lived the experience together for the listening time; another let each one decide on his own time of meditation with the text; a third proposed one community meeting per day. Among the original local initiatives, we must highlight a daily meditated rosary at the end of the morning at the Provincial House; this same local community also scheduled a celebration at Le Repos Saint-François d'Assise cemetery.

DEATH OF BROTHER GEORGES CROTEAU



he death of o u r confrere has shaken many people. Still active in pastoral work with adults and young people taking part in World Youth Days, Brother Georges had his own way of

bringing people to Jesus. In times of pandemic, faced with the constraints imposed by Public Health for religious assemblies in different zones, the Provincial Council had, in consultation with the family of the deceased, proposed a visit to the Garneau Funeral Home (Trois-Rivières) for a short period of two hours before the body was cremated. The members of

Bro. Georges' family could not attend mostly because of the pandemic affecting the area where they live.

All the confreres of the Trois-Rivières region celebrated the life of Brother Georges Croteau, accompanied by Brothers René Delorme and André Roberge, who had come from Montreal, by Mesdames Hélène Périgny and Dolorès Arcand, cooks in our two communities of Trois-Rivières, and by Mr Marc Zongo, a resident at the house on Viger Street. Two short hours of prayers, exchanges of memories, accounts of fraternal deeds and gestures, reminders of his pastoral action with the faithful, students, pilgrims, and parishioners.

The ashes are kept for future funerals, at the time of deconfinement. Young people from the WYD attended a mass that was celebrated in the Sanctuary of Notre-Dame-du-Cap.

SANT GABRIEL TV

his year, as part of the Community Service, the Sant Gabriel Televisió project has been launched. One day a week, the fourth-year ESO pupils, broadcast via their own You Tube Channel, twenty to thirty minutes of news, covering a wide spectrum: issues related to the COVID-19 pandemic, relevant information about the school, the Municipality, short reports of general interest, interviews on the fields of cooperativism, associations, equality, etc.

A team each has been created in classes to function, emulating the way professional channels work, assigning roles and responsibilities like those of editors, writers, programme directors, and production teams. The material is prepared and recorded, with the help of a chroma system, during class time and in the school's auditorium.

The project, which produces very interesting results, is based on two main axis: the first is to





EASTER IN SAINT LOUIS DE MONTFORT SCHOOL

rom Thursday, 18 March 2021, the children of Saint Louis-Marie Grignion de Montfort School, in Frossay, could gradually embark on a journey that would lead them to Easter.

Every morning, in a very visible place near the schoolyard, a new visual representation stimulated the children's interest: it was a "silent" but "expressive" silhouette which was accompanied by "the question of the day".

That visual representation, which was under permanent construction, would ultimately be nine meters wide and two meters high. The objective was to encourage the children to share among themselves, both on the playground and in the classroom, concerning the "discoveries" they made every day.

"The question of the day" invited each one to keep on searching and to imagine what would come out on the following day. It was in the form of a riddle referring to a Gospel passage which gave meaning to the new visual they would see the next morning.

All the children, teachers and members of the educational team lived this approach to Easter with interest. While the drawing got bigger and bigger, the question of the day was a constant source of motivation: "Will I find the answer?" Every day, I e-mailed the pictures and "the question of the day" to the parents.

The main moments of the process were: Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter day.

A celebration, with the parish priest, had been prepared and was to take place near the visual representation on Tuesday, 6 April. However, it had to be delayed to a later date because of the pandemic.

But the words of appreciation from parents, children and members of the educational team encourage us to go on and renew such a kind of experience.

As in the past, MCDS along with India Vision Institute conducted Eye Screening. About Eight Hundred people benefitted through this Free Eye Screening Camp. Free Spectacles were distributed to those with defective vision in March 2021. More than two hundred people benefitted through these camps.

COVID TASK FORCE

COUNSELLING HELP DURING THE PANDEMIC

news item given in the front page of 'Times of India', on 24th May 2021 was titled, Northeast likely to be next Covid hotspot.



The world is currently facing the second and deadly wave of Covid-19. Though the number of

people infected are growing less, the number of people affected physically and mentally by this Pandemic are increasing at an accelerating rate. Understanding the seriousness of the situation the North East India Regional Bishop's Council (NEIRBC- comprises of 7 states of North East India) called for a meeting of the secretaries of various commissions, the Executive members of the North East Regional Conference of Religious in India and the representatives of NGO's working in the region for an online meeting to discuss on 'What can the Catholic Church do in this present scenario?'

In response to the suggestions received in the online meeting, the North East India Regional Bishop's Council (NEIRBC) set up a Regional Central Team to care for the safety and the wellbeing of the victims of the pandemic in the North East and to provide emotional and psychological support for them during the second wave of Corona Virus Pandemic.

As a member of the Regional Central Team, Bro. Varghese Mandapathil, SG took up the responsibility entrusted to him by the NEI Covid Task Force, to identify trained Counsellors in the Northeast Region and form a team of counsellors who will provide psychological support to the people of the region, affected due to stress and other emotional difficulties. The NEI COVID TASK

FORCE counsellors are divided into different teams based on language they are comfortable with and the time when they are available to give online psychological support to the people affected due to stress and other emotional difficulties during this pandemic.


As of now the number of trained Counsellors with specialization in different areas who have responded to the call of NEI task force coordinator, Bro. Varghese Mandapathil and volunteered to provide Mental Health support to the people of North East India stands at 50. A Team of five Senior Counsellors headed by Bro. George Padikara of the Province of Bengaluru, forms the 'Supervision Team' who will supervise the work of the Counsellors.

An online Zoom meeting titled 'Introduction and Orientation for NEI Covid Task Force Counsellors was hosted on the 26th of May 2021 at 5.30 p.m. by the Coordinator so that all the counsellors get to know the task they have volunteered for.

On the 27th of May 2021 an online training session on 'Online Counselling for the NEI Covid Task Force Counsellors was hosted by Mr. Paras Sharma, an expert on online counselling.

The Counselling help is scheduled to start by the 1st week of June 2021.

AU STUDENTS HONORED WITH PRESTIGIOUS WORLD PEACE ETHICS AWARDS


ix AU Students from Schools of Arts, Music and Engineering distinguished themselves in the 12th World Peace Ethics Contest and won top prizes for the first time.

ONLINE FORMATION MEETING FOR ASSOCIATES AND COLLABORATORS

PROVINCE OF SPAIN

n Saturday 20 February, the associates and collaborators of the Province of Spain held a virtual meeting, simultaneously in Catalunya and Madrid-La Aguilera areas, to reflect on how to face the problems and difficulties that life presents to us, taking St. Louis Marie de Montfort as our model.

The dynamics of the session consisted of a review of the information previously sent to the participants and a joint reflection.

Thanks to the study of neuro-linguistic programming by José Luis Sandoval Romera, a Montfort missionary, we learned the strategies

> that Montfort used to face the "crosses" that he experienced, as a consequence of: his radical way of following Jesus, his abandonment to Providence, his pressing call to live the Gospel and the demands of baptism.

Our founder's aim was to please God, an eight-step process:

Montfort taught others to live each day as it came in order to live in peace, because fear and tension cause passivity and anxiety. Louis-Marie's



belief in God's Providence is a great help to all of us who need to respond to the demands of this complicated world and, at the same time, to avoid stress. This belief, abandoning ourselves to Providence, far from making us resign ourselves, will make us always more active in the search for alternatives and solutions and at the same time happier.

During the time of reflection that followed, brothers and laypeople gave their opinions on the subject, their life experience in the face of difficulties, the strategies that they found most difficult to carry out...

The joy of seeing each other again and the dialogue we were able to establish, which enriched us all, makes us look forward to the next meeting on 17 April.

TO THE ENCOUNTER WITH WISDOM IN SCRIPTURE JOINT FORMATION OF BROTHERS AND LAY PEOPLE

PROVINCE OF SPAIN

n 27 February, the first of the two videoconferences planned for the joint formation of Brothers and Lay People of the Province of Spain was held, to which 33 people connected from different parts of the country.



After the opening prayer, the Provincial introduced the speaker, Sr. Lourdes Alonso, Daughter of Wisdom, who presented the theme: To the encounter with Wisdom in Scripture which is, "like a lover's letter to her beloved to win his affection" (LEW 65).

Sister Lourdes explained that for Montfort the Word of God was the centre of his life, of his writings and of his missionary activity; and that his whole spirituality depended on his continuous meditation of Holy Scripture.

Biblical Wisdom is the unifying element of St Louis Marie's spirituality.

A better understanding of the biblical spirituality

of wisdom will help us to understand that Montfort is neither an illuminati nor an eccentric, but, in reality, Fr de Montfort:

- was passionate about God
- who meditated on Scripture (passionate about scripture)
- and who, having been captivated by what he discovered of the figure of Wisdom in the Bible, acquired new lights to contemplate Jesus of Nazareth in a specific way, and decided to imitate him literally.
- And hence his decisions, gestures, concrete customs...

Sister Lourdes showed us the slow evolution of the theme of wisdom in the Old Testament. Thus we saw how wisdom appeared as a...

- 1. In the book of Proverbs and throughout biblical wisdom literature it is a human quality;
- 2. after Exodus, it is understood as an attribute, a quality of God himself;
- 3. in the Book of Wisdom, chapter 9, it is stated that it is a gift of God to be asked for;
- 4. and in the last period of the O.T., wisdom is presented as personified in a female figure.
- 5. Then we look at five major blocks, where Montfort is based to live on attitudes which do not appease the behaviour of the world and of the society in which he lived: Proverbs 8, 1-21 / Proverbs 8, 22-35 / Proverbs 9, 1-6 / Sirach 24, 1-22 / Wisdom 9, 1-18 / Wisdom of Solomon 9, 1-22.

On Saturday, **March 6**, we met again for the second part of this joint formation. After a summary of the contents of the previous session, Sister Lourdes Alonso presented **Wisdom in the New Testament** where:

I Jesus behaves like a teacher of wisdom



. It is presented implicitly and explicitly as the very wisdom of which the OT speaks.

II The different meanings of Wisdom are also found in the New Testament:

- 1. The human Wisdom valued in OT. is also in the New: as a human quality and divine trait that are related to the pursuit of happiness and that do not always coincide. And we speak of false wisdoms. The place of absolute and extreme confrontation between the wisdom of men and the Wisdom of God is the cross of Jesus.
- 2 True wisdom is in God and is a gift from God and is always related to the Spirit.
- 3 It manifests itself in Creation, Salvation and enables man to receive the revelation of the plan of salvation and to act according to God's will.
- 4 Christ is for the faithful the source of true Wisdom, which comes from God.



In short, Montfort:

- ✓ recognized in Jesus of Nazareth the traits of Wisdom spoken of in the Old Testament and
- √ tried to reproduce these traits in his life.
- ✓ And how does this help us in our Montfortian life? What are the consequences for those of us who live Montfortian spirituality?

A better understanding of the figure of Biblical Wisdom helps us:

- enrich our contemplation of Jesus of Nazareth because it draws our attention to some particular aspects of his life and message, of his person, of his ministry, of his way of living among human beings.... of a particular way of living as a christian... of situating oneself in the world and in the Church.
- understand Father de Montfort better and live better with his spiritual intuition today in the world that is ours and in the context that is ours too.

CONCLUSION:

Acquiring Wisdom is the goal of Montfortian spirituality. St. Louis Marie transmits it to the people in the language that was accessible to them: the renewal of the baptismal promises, living the promises of Baptism. It is a parallel way of presenting its primary intention, that of acquiring true Wisdom.

In the dialogue that followed, especially on the part of the lay people, the gratitude to Sr. Lourdes for bringing us closer to a key theme of Montfortian spirituality in an accessible and clear way was evident.
