Theme: For a Consecrated Life, purified and cured of the ferments of perversity and vice. (cf. 1 Cor 5:8)

From July 31 to August 16, 2023, in Italy.

In the context of the Ongoing Formation, eighteen (18) Brothers from the Provinces of East Africa, Brazzaville and Kinshasa benefited from the contribution of resource persons who developed relevant themes to help the participants make the most of their Spiritual Renewal Session. They are: Bro. Bernard Guesdon, Archivist of the Congregation, Bro. Jean Marie Thior, Secretary General of the Congregation and Local Superior of the General House, Bro. Dionigi Taffarello, Vicar General of the Congregation, Bro. Paul Texier, in-charge of welcoming the visitors to the General House and Sr. Rose Mama Diouf of the Daughters of the Resurrection.

As a sign of hospitality, the Community of the General House organised a welcome ceremony on Monday, July 31, 2023, during which the Superior General extended a warm welcome to everyone. Afterwards, it was up to the participants to introduce themselves and briefly share their respective missions, as a way of getting to know each other well, in order to form one body and journey together. An aperitif and a simple

dinner brought the evening to a close.

On Tuesday, August 01, 2023, the Session was officially opened with a beautiful prayer led by Bro. Bernard Guesdon and Bro. Louis Anthonysamy. Afterwards, Bro. Jean Marie Thior, the Local Superior of the General House, read out the



practical Information about the house and the city of Rome. Then, Bro. Jean Paul Mbengue, in-charge for the Session, in his welcoming address, invited all the Brothers taking part in the Session to make the most of the contributions of this formation for the spiritual growth of each one, for his determination and effectiveness in responding to the needs of this World where the witness of the consecrated person is eagerly expected.

He stressed on the importance that the Institute in general and the Provinces in particular place on such a session. It is a costly Formation in terms of financial resources, energy and time spent in preparing it, he emphasised. He invited the Brothers, in order to be



purified and cured of the ferments of perversity and vice, to hear and allow themselves to be challenged by the repeated calls of Pope Francis to the World in general and to the Christian faithful in particular, in the ten years since he became Pope.

- The "geographical and existential peripheries";
- The Integral ecology (Laudato Si);
- The Worldliness;
- The Synodality;
- The Mercy;
- The culture of encounter (Fratelli Tutti 2020);
- The poor;
- The crisis (Health, education, environment);
- The Ideological, political and economic colonisation;
- The corruption.



After this exhortation, it was the turn of Bro. John Kallarackal, Superior General, to deliver his profound message, punctuated by six points and a poem as a conclusion.

1) Formation has to be a constant and permanent concern.

A formation whose elements of religious life have to be oriented towards the edification of the Inner Man. A formation whose fundamentals have to be based on four (4) pillars which are: The quality of spiritual life, the quality of intellectual life, the quality of community life and the quality of apostolic life. The four pillars should not be understood as sequential; they are interactive.

2) The stages undertaken by the Montfort Brothers of Saint Gabriel.

Bro. John reminded us of some of the Orientations of past General Chapters, starting with the 29th General Chapter held in 2000 and ending with the 32nd General Chapter held in 2018. He also outlined some of the articles of the Rule of Life, the source of our mission.

3) The need for ongoing, appropriate Formation

Formation is meant to help us grow in wisdom and in the art of real life. The Holy Spirit is the Formator par excellence who inspires us in the fullness of our mission.

- 4) Walking together in the footsteps of Saint Louis-Marie de Montfort, who said to us in a very short formula: "To God alone, through Christ Incarnate Wisdom, in the Spirit, in communion with Mary, for the reign of God".
- 5) The True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin.
- 6) The Love of Eternal Wisdom and the Wisdom of the Cross.

The message concluded with a poem entitled: "Take Jesus with you".

After the address delivered by Bro. John Kallarackal, we began to share three questions that had been put to us in preparation for the session. This sharing continued until the afternoon.

August 2023



From 02 August to August 15, 2023, a series of lectures were given and visits were organised to some of the most significant historical sites in Rome. The themes were developed with pedagogy to the great satisfaction of the session participants who willingly decided to be the ambassadors of the content of the conferences in their respective Provinces. These themes are: "The need for a new impetus for a better knowledge of the writings and life of Montfort" by Bro. Bernard Guesdon; a) "Availability and the Mission Ad Extra" and "Today, the Mission can only be understood as a shared mission with the laity" by Bro. Jean-Marie Thior; "The need for the Communities to be places of welcome that cultivate hope, peace and joy" by Bro. Dionigi Taffarello; "Living and transmitting Marian devotion in a renewed language and daring to set out like Father de Montfort, daring and creative, abandoning ourselves to divine providence on the road to mission" by Bro. Paul Texier and "New social communication technologies, threats and opportunities? For a proper use of these technologies at the service of personal and Community life and for the mission" by Sr. Rose M. Diouf.

Each speaker, in his own style and according to the theme assigned to him, was able to re-energise the participants in the session. Drawing on human experience, theology, philosophy and the Montfortian-Gabrielite heritage, the speakers aroused great interest among the participants. They were unanimously praised for their ability to adapt to the audience and keep them on their toes.

Another rhythm of life deserves to be highlighted in the Session Programme: The visits to religious and tourist sites, under the guidance of Bro. Paul Texier, who knew how to balance the historical narratives, dates, anecdotes and also moments of silence to enable the participants in the session to appreciate. It would be impossible to draw up an exhaustive list, which is why we have chosen to mention here some places that will remain indelibly etched in our memories: The four basilicas of Rome, and those of Loreto and Assisi.

On Monday, August 14, was held the concluding ceremony of the first part of the programme, which took place in Italy, followed on Tuesday, August 15 by the Assumption Mass in St Peter's Square in thanksgiving for all the blessings received from the Lord during our stay in Rome.

From the words of the Superior General, Bro. John Kallarackal, when he sent us on mission, we can retain

three exhortations taken from General Chapters:

- Committed to the same cause and called to be evangelisers and witnesses of God's love and compassion through our various apostolates in our respective entities.
- The experience of Paul's encounter with the Lord that Pope Francis highlighted in the general audience held on 9th October, 2019, when he said: "Saul's encounter with Jesus begins with a journey that sees Saul transformed into Paul, the instrument chosen by God to bring the name of the Lord to all nations. In passing from blindness to sight, Paul begins to see the world in an entirely new way".
- Two points from the bold statement made during the 31st General Chapter: "We acknowledge that we, Brothers, are influenced by the dominant counter-values of our culture, which ensnare us in the dynamics of consumerism, superficiality, individualism and greed".

Montfort Brothers of Saint Gabriel, we are called to a serious process of Spiritual Renewal which will lead us, as individuals and as a community, to reduce the distance between our documents and our life, in order to live a visible, credible and prophetic spirituality. For us Brothers of Saint Gabriel, this renewal means revisiting our charism and living it with the same enthusiasm, creativity and inventiveness as Saint Louis-Marie de Montfort, Blessed Marie-Louise Trichet, Father Gabriel Deshayes, our collaborators and pioneers, while remaining faithful to the tradition handed down, but also to that adapted to the challenges of our time.

On Wednesday, August 16, 2023, we left the General House in Rome for France, where the second part of the Session will be dedicated to the footsteps of Montfort.

QUARTERLY REPORT - APRIL - JUNE 2023

ear All, MCDS deems it a privilege to share the report of our activities for the quarter ending June 2023.

Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR):

All our four CBR centres functioned, with their regular activities including occupational therapy, physiotherapy, vocational skills training and monthly parents' meetings, with a short summer break of 15 days during the second half of May 2023. Apart from Monthly Parents meetings, Therapists facilitated individual Goal setting for the clients for three months duration with the active involvement of parents to follow up the pattern designated to them during the weekends and on vacations. Considerable progress has been observed as outcome results. Pre-employment training in hospitality, housekeeping and shop management for our Special Youth were conducted regularly.

One-day picnic:

MCDS Special Children and Youth along with their siblings and parents were taken for a 'One Day Picnic' to 'Palaar Urban Farms'. They thoroughly enjoyed their day coming in close contact with nature with lots of fun and games.

An annual survey by MCDS staff identified differently-abled underprivileged children and youth in the relocated areas of Ezhil Nagar, Kannagi Nagar, Old and New Perumbakkam. They were admitted in our centres for this academic year and we support them additionally in procuring Government ID Cards, Pension forms and other freebies.

One of our Special Youth undergoing vocational training at Vocational Rehabilitation Centre (Government of India), Guindy along with other Seven youths from MCDS, was selected for the Four Star Hospitality Group in Chennai with a monthly package of Rs.9000/- during the period of apprenticeship. MCDS and the Special Youth parents were overwhelmed upon hearing this and it paved the way for the other Special Youths in the near future.









Study Centres:





All our study centres resumed to function from 1st June, 2023. Children were very happy to be back to their centres as well as to meet their friends. They were involved in Drawing, Crafts, Sports and Cultural activities apart from their academic session.

MCDS organised a day-long "Holiday Activities" for the Study Centre students, in collaboration with the "Clay Finger Seven" organisation at MCDS Office Pallavaram. The camp was avidly pursued by the pupils with Paper crafts, paper costumes, action songs, storytelling, painting and balloon game activities. Brother George P. J., a counselling psychologist conducted an input session. Before returning to their locations, they had a pilgrimage to St. Thomas Mount. At the Hill Top, they enjoyed the panoramic view of the city and the airport.

Health Programme:





Clinic on Wheels with the Medical Team of a trained Medical Practitioner, trained Nurse, supporting staff and equipped with sufficient stock of free medicines reached out to more than Four Thousand and Five hundred beneficiaries in our predetermined areas in the Slums and Slum relocated areas during this reporting period. Patients with blood pressure and Sugar complaints wait for the arrival of our Ambulance for their regular quota of medicines.

Eye Screening and Spectacles Distribution:

In collaboration with the "India Vision Institute" (IVI), MCDS organized Eye Screening programmes for the underprivileged people in the relocated slum areas, benefitting nearly Three Hundred people. More than Two Hundred Spectacles were distributed to those with defective vision after the screenings by the 'India Vision Institute' between January and March 2023.



Tobacco Free Awareness:

SHG members with their families from Srinivasapuram & Pattinapakkam attended the 'Tabacco Free Awareness Programme' organized in association with 'TTK Hospital

Tailoring Skill Training supported by 'ABRAO GROUP':

The 'Fifth batch of tailoring trainees' successfully completed their six-month training and were issued official certificates at the valedictory function. For the first time all the trainees of this batch were presented Free Tailoring machine in recognition of their exceptional performance. The Sixth Batch started their training in mid-April in the presence of dignitaries. With a systematic schedule formatted and under the active supervision of experienced teachers the beneficiaries attend their training with eagerness and enthusiasm.

Senior Citizens' Forum:





All our Elders had their regular exercise, Yoga, Meditation, General Health check-ups and sharing of medicinal tips during this reporting period. After a short break for summer vacation, the Elders Centre reopened in June 2023.

Observation Visit:

Students of fourth-year Nursing along with their faculty from Mohammed Sathak College of Nursing visited our Chemmencherry Centre for an observation visit and to learn about our organization, various programmes, and therapies given to Special Children. They spent quality time with them.

Annual Evaluation and Planning:

As in the past, MCDS methodically Evaluated our performance of the activities last year using the SWOT analysis pattern. This exercise was followed by planning for the forthcoming academic year as a combined effort along with its staff.

We acknowledge and thank our funding partners, ABRAO Group, BW Designs, Astrotech Steels, Montfort Old Boys, Rotary Club of Madras North, Institute of the Brothers of St. Gabriel - Rome and generous persons of Goodwill for their continued support of the programmes carried out by MCDS for the downtrodden and underprivileged of the Society.

GLIMPSES OF PROVINCIAL'S VISIT TO COMMUNITIES AND INSTITUTIONS IN THE PROVINCE









Sunil Britto, CFC, and each one of the Local Superiors and Heads of Institutions who were present for this important meeting. He said that Pope Francis has invited the whole church to make a Synodal journey. A journey to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds and weave together relationships. He further said that this meeting need to awaken a dawn of hope among the Brothers of Northeast Province and inspire others with a vision of the future filled with the joy of the Gospel. In chapter three of the Fratelli Tutti, Pope Francis talks about the stranger on the road, the Good Samaritan (Lk10:30-37), the man who became a brother to the other man who needed him most at that point in time. He challenged the Brothers present by asking "With whom can we identify ourselves? The Priest? the Levite or the good Samaritan"? This is a question each Brother needs to ask oneself, as we are preparing for the Provincial Chapter and the General Chapter on the theme 'Montfortian Prophetic Presence in the 21st Century.' The Historical Jesus of Nazareth was a revolutionary – whereas the Jesus of the Christians has been defined and imprisoned inside our churches and institutions. It is good to ask ourselves, he said, "Are we Brothers imprisoned in the four walls of the Institutions or are we free to rush where the Lord is calling us to answer the cry of the suffering People. Like Moses was called by Yahweh to address the cry of the people of Israel, in Egypt.

In the 1st session, Bro. Sunil Britto CFC, explained the various Leaderships in Congregations such as Traditional leadership, Servant Leadership and Participatory Leadership. He followed it up with a presentation on different Levels of Listening' and said "In Listening from the Source, we tap into a transformative form of listening that emanates from the future, yearning for new possibilities to emerge. This type of listening remains open and receptive, connecting us to a motivating shift in our collective vision. By embracing this approach, we can expect significant changes to unfold within our communities". While speaking on 'Generative Listening' he touched upon various factors such as listening to all the words, listening with all the senses, listening to all the emotions, suspending judgments, and noticing our own feelings.

In the interactive session that followed the presentation, Bro. Britto answered many questions posed by the Brothers such as - the appointment of lay persons

as Principals in Montfort Schools, feminine energy within us and in our society - feminine leadership, and the point on listening to our own feelings etc.

The members were then dispersed for group discussion on a question on "How can I be a synodal member in my community?" which was followed by a presentation by each of the groups on their take on the topic given.

The Morning sessions with Bro. Sunil Britto concluded with a vote of thanks by Bro. Philip.

In the sessions that followed the Brothers listened to the plans of each commission shared by the conveners of the respective commissions, for the coming year and a report on the financial situation of the Province presented by Bro. Thomas Thannickal, the Provincial Bursar.

While all the communities presented their 'Community Projects for the year 2023 - 24' with their short-term and long-term goals, the Brothers came to understand how each community has planned to share their responsibilities, approach their apostolates other than the school, organize outreach programmes and Vocation Promotion Programmes. They also listened to the action taken by each community regarding 'Synodality, Laudato Si and the preparation of the community for the General and the Provincial Chapters.

The Brothers also spent a considerable amount of time reading and understanding the various rules and code of conduct of the 'Service Rules'.

Brothers spent time listening to Bro. P. J. Philip as he gave a presentation on 'School Administration' in which he pointed out that there is an increased awareness among educators of the need to integrate what is called as 21st Century skills in educational systems and emphasized that the need of the hour is that schools must focus on enhancing the skills required for successful adult life in the 21st Century. He further said that it is important that the students are able to think scientifically, mathematically, or artistically to face real-life challenges in an information and



technology-driven world and enhance their inherent potential.

Brothers were enlightened about the Implementation of Province Policies such Child Protection Protocol, IPC, NC PCR, Fire Safety, School Safety Check List, Disaster Management and new structures through Bro. Soosai's presentation.

On the final day, the Brothers spent time on the General Concerns expressed by some of the Brothers. They were discussed and clarified.

In the concluding session, Bro. Provincial pointed out that the most important role of the Local Superior is to be an effective animator and a supervisor who approaches his mission with a bird's eye view and understands the overall situation rather than micromanaging everything. He further said that this could be achieved if the Local Superiors create time by delegating responsibilities to collaborators, associates and partners as section-in-charges, Subject -in-charges, Vice - Principals, etc.

Another important factor that Bro. Provincial emphasized to the Brothers was 'Personal Health'. He said that their bodies are the only homes in the world that they have to live in till the end of their lives and are to treat each one's body as the temple of God. He said that if they do not take care of their bodies no one else would. He urged Brothers who have crossed forty-five years of age to go for check-ups on a regular basis.

He then expressed his gratitude to the Moderators, the Secretaries who have been serving quietly in the background and the Local Community for all the arrangements made. Bro. Provincial concluded the Local Superiors and the Heads of the Institutions Meet 2023 by thanking all the Local Superiors and the Heads of the institutions for actively taking part in all the sessions and making the Meet a grand success.

of Bellefontaine in
Bégrolles en Mauges
(49) as a resident. In

this interview, Christian describes his new living environment and shares his unique experience.

LP: Many readers of the "Lettre Provinciale" know Bellefontaine Abbey or have stayed there. Can you tell us a little about the history of this Abbey?

F. Christian: Bellefontaine has been a monastic settlement since the 11th century. The site is at the crossroads of three provinces: Brittany, Poitou, and Anjou. Its proximity to the ancient Roman road from Nantes to Poitiers and the presence of water springs encouraged Benedictine monks to pass through and settle here. During the French Revolution, the Abbey was sold in 1791, and the events of the "Vendée Wars" followed. On 3 May 1816, Father Urbain Guillet, a Trappist monk, bought the first part of the estate to re-establish Cistercian monastic life. The community underwent phases of expansion at the end of the 19th century, founding monasteries in Canada and again in 1972 in Benin. It also welcomed 3 brothers, declared "blessed", who gave their lives at Tibhirine.

The Abbey estate extends over 120 hectares, declared as "organic farming". Three partner farmers cultivate around 80 ha and the rest is maintained by the community (including 7 ha within the monastery grounds where the kiwi orchard is located), with woodland, meadows, an apple orchard, three springs, and numerous buildings.

LP: What are the Abbey's richness and potential in 2023?

F. Christian: The Abbey estate is very accessible, less than an hour from Nantes and Angers, and twenty minutes from Cholet. It's a protected, quiet

orchards, and garden, there are a number of wellmaintained buildings, from the bread oven to a 100seat conference room. In the reception wing, 7 fully equipped rooms with kitchenettes are available. There are worship facilities, a 500-seat church, and a 100-seat outdoor chapel, known as the Chapelle de Bon Secours, which was a hotbed of resistance during the French Revolution. What's more, a centuries-old way of life, animated by the Rule of Saint Benedict, can help people far beyond the monks in their search for a good, balanced life. That's why the welcome is so widespread. The guest house, where I provide my services, has 35 rooms with the possibility of listening and spiritual guidance. The daily liturgy at Bellefontaine is open and appreciated. A memorial to the brothers of Tibhirine, with a space for meditation, is currently under construction. The Abbey also has a good theological and spiritual library.

LP: But, like most Cistercian Abbeys in France, does the monastic community of Bellefontaine have any weaknesses? What weaknesses? And how do you deal with them?

F. Christian: Since the second half of the twentieth century, changes in society and in religious practice have led to a significant drop in the number of people entering monastic life, opening up another challenge for this place. The current demographic structure (15 monks with an average age of 76) means that the burden of work and responsibilities falls on a small number of brothers, resulting in an imbalance that affects the coherence of their way of life. For example, they are no longer able to take overall responsibility for their food chain, from the vegetable garden to the kitchen, whereas this has always been the case. The monastic community therefore needs to be supported and even replaced in the management of the estate and buildings. In addition, the health of the older brothers requires attention. Bellefontaine's economic model, which is currently based solely on commercial activity (with the agricultural base of the orchards) and hospitality, needs to evolve. Over a year

ago, the community began a process of reflection on this subject with two professional coaches in order to envisage the future of Bellefontaine.

The monks have decided to remain on the site of the Abbey, but to envisage a form of "monastic cohabitation", to be determined, with one or more partners, is yet to be found. So, on Saturday 25 March, at the invitation of the monks, over a hundred people came together for a wonderful day of meeting, sharing, and fellowship. Ideas came thick and fast. Some envisaged Bellefontaine as a "campus of transitions" towards a new world of ecology, solidarity, and spirituality. Others see the site as a place where the "Beautiful meets the Divine" in artistic and musical expression. Still, others see Bellefontaine as an ideal place to welcome people undergoing reconstruction or in need of hospitality... The final choice of partners will require time for the community to deepen its understanding and to discern.

LP: F. Christian, although you're not a Bellefontaine's brother, you've been working in the Abbey's "Welcome Center" for almost a year now. What does that mean today?

F. Christian: Since July 2022, under the responsibility of the hotelier brother, I've been at the service of welcoming people and groups. We welcome more than 200 people a month in Bellefontaine. Firstly, there are the individuals. From the priest or nun coming for their annual retreat to the person simply looking for a place of calm and serenity, to the pilgrim on his way to St. James, or the student preparing his plays. We also welcome many different groups: parishes, movements, confirmands, scouts, associations, and even promotions of students from higher education schools who come to live at the Abbey for a week as part of their curriculum.


LP: What qualities does this kind of hospitality require?

F. Christian: It's true that welcoming a wide range of people requires first of all an openness to the people who come along and who don't always fit the "format" of the typical retreatant. Welcoming diverse groups means having to make the "big leap" between a rather traditionalist group like the Knights of Malta and a more "agitated" group from Catholic Action Ouvrière. It also requires discernment not to allow yourself to be taken advantage of by those you meet. It's hard work, but it's rewarding because

so many people come to Bellefontaine to tell their stories, share painful moments in their lives, and simply find a sympathetic ear. Several monks provide this accompaniment service, which is even more important than the accommodation, but trained lay people are needed to support the monks who are getting on in years.

LP: And you, F. Christian, what has this new experience brought you personally over the last year?

F. Christian: I still don't fully appreciate how lucky I am to already be living in a form of "monastic cohabitation". For me, it's an essential help in structuring my daily life with an almost immutable timetable. I'm staying at the entrance to the Abbey, in a place planned for the future development of a "reception center", which will take over from the current porter, who is... 99 years old! I live in a beautiful environment that helps me to de-stress by walking the paths of the pretty Mauges countryside every day. Finally, and most importantly, the regular, high-quality liturgical prayer of the Bellefontaine community is a rock for me, a pillar on which I base my personal spiritual life. I haven't become a monk, but I have a bond with them that brings me a great deal of ... while respecting each person's call and gift.

We offered a wreath of flowers to the martyred Brothers, evoking their names and recalling certain

He added that the cause of beatification of our Martyrs Brothers was well advanced and he was optimistic that we would be able to venerate them soon.

The remembrance ceremony was followed by the Eucharist, presided over by Father Justino and concelebrated by Brothers Ángel and Faustino. It was with great joy that we prayed, sang, and acclaimed Christ, the first martyr who offered himself to the Father as a sacrifice for our salvation. All this in the hope that our Brothers will soon be recognized by the Church and venerated on the altars as other saints.

After mass, we enjoyed a fraternal meal sprinkled with Ribera del Duero wine. After lunch, we continued our conversation in the park, around the swimming pool, before bidding farewell to our guests, who left La Aguilera happy to have shared with us a day of commemoration of our courageous Brothers.

<u>CLASS OF 1997</u> BRO. ETIENNE SOULEYMANE KA

Brother Etienne Souleymane KA, originally from the parish of Saint Benoît l'Africain in Mbodiène, was appointed as a teacher in Salémata from October 1997 to December 1998. After the closure of the Salémata community, he joined the Mbour community for training at the CFP. After training at the CFP, from 1999 to 2000, he was posted to Fatick as a teacher at the collège du Sine, where he passed the Certificat d'aptitude pédagogique (CAP). From 2001 to 2006, he was head of the René Merceron Institution in Mbour.

From 2006 to 2009: he was sent to France to study. After three years, he obtained a Master's degree in Education.



Upon his return to Senegal in 2009, Brother Etienne took in charge of Collège du Sine Middle School until 2011

From 2011 to 2017, he joined the Malika community as director of the Institution Saint Louis Marie Grignion until his appointment as Provincial Superior, a post he currently holds.

BROTHER RÉMY NDONG

Brother Rémy is from the Parish of Notre Dame de la Purification in Joal. After taking his vows, he was sent to Saint Peter's College in Dakar to teach English.

From 1998 to 2003, Brother Rémy taught English at Collège Saint Gabriel. After the college community, he joined the Juniorate community in 1999.

From 2003 to 2007 Rémy took a Master's degree in English at the Catholic University of Angers in France. On his return to Senegal, he joined Thiès, where he was an English teacher, deputy director of the Juniorate, and director of Saint Gabriel College.

Since 2019, he has been assigned to the Mbour community as headmaster of the René MERCERON Institution.

BROTHER GERVAIS SAMBOU

Brother Gervais is from Mlomp. His home parish is Sacred Heart. After his vows, he was assigned to the community of the Technical Centre from 1997 to 2006 as a teacher and then director of the centre. In 2002, he obtained his BTI in Electrical Engineering from the CFPT Senegal/Japan. The following year, in 2003, he obtained a DTS in Computer Maintenance. In 2006, he passed his BTS in Automation at CFPT. From 2007 to 2008, he was assigned to the Thiès campus. From 2009 to 2013, he was transferred to Dédougou in Burkina Faso as a teacher. From 2013 to 2020, he was sent to Thailand for postgraduate studies. On his return to Senegal in 2020, he was appointed director

of the Saint Montfort Technical Centre in Médina, a post he currently holds.

CLASS OF 1998 BROTHER JEAN GRÉGOIRE COLY

Brother Jean Grégoire COLY comes from the parish of Saint Joseph de Soutou. He began his life as an apostolic religious in the Fatick community from September 1998 to July 2000. In this jubilee year, he studied Theology at the Université Catholique de l'Ouest de la France, in Angers. In 2004, he returned to Fatick as head of the Juniorate. From September 2005 to October 2010, he lived in the railroad city, where he was in charge of the large Juniorate, the novitiate, and the pre-novitiate in the Lazaret district.

October 2010 saw the start of the ad extra mission to Guinea. Three years later, in September 2013, it was time to serve at the novitiate in Brazzaville, which unfortunately lasted only one year. Then it was back to Thiès to serve the novitiate until September 2019. Back on the road again for mission ad extra, still in Guinea from 2019 to 2021. Then to Abidjan, in Côte d'Ivoire, at the Saint Miguel scholasticate from September 2021 to the present day.

BROTHER ADRIEN MAR

Brother Adrien, originally from the parish of Sainte Jeanne D'ARC in Fatick, was sent after his first vows to the teacher training centre in Mbour. After this year of teacher training, he was assigned to Saint Joseph's school in Ndiébel, where he obtained his teaching certificate (CAP). In 2001, he left Ndiébel for a year of Portuguese immersion in Lisbon. From 2002 to 2006, he was sent to Guinea Bissau to teach at the Maria Montessori school. From 2006 to 2008, he worked as a teacher at the René Merceron community in Mbour. In 2009, he returned to the missions. He was first sent to Dédougou in Burkina Faso as a teacher, then to Manga as a founding member of the community and headmaster of the Saint Gabriel private secondary school. He held this position until 2018. On his return

to Senegal, he joined the Saint Gabriel de Thiès secondary school community as a teacher and head of the Kër Dioubo boarding school. At the same time, he began training at FASTEF in Letters - History - Geography. Since 2021, he has been a member of the Tivaouane Peul community and a teacher at the Institution Saint François d'Assise.

BRO. PAUL MICHEL NDOUR

Brother Paul Michel NDOUR comes from the Conversion Saint Paul parish in Djilasse. After his 1st vows, he was assigned to the Saint Pierre community where he taught English.

From 2000 to 2002 he was sent to Canada to study psychology. On his return to Senegal in 2002, he was assigned to Saint Gabriel College as a teacher until 2007. From 2007 to 2008, he joined Saint Pierre School group as a teacher. From 2008 to 2009, he underwent a formation at Mater Christi Religious Training Center Training Center in Burkina Faso. From 2009 to 2010, he was appointed novice master in Thiès. From 2010 to 2013, he was sent to Brazzaville as a formator at the novitiate. From 2013 to 2014, he was posted to Guinea Conakry as head of the postulancy. From 2014 to 2020, he returned to Thiès as head of the postulancy. Since 2020, he has been at the Tivaouane Peulh community, where he is Prefect of Discipline.

BRO. JOSEPH SALOUM TINE

A Montfort Brother of Saint-Gabriel by the grace of God and originally from the Parish of Saint-Pierre Julien Eymard in Koudiadiène, situated halfway between Thiès and Tivaouane, Brother Joseph, after his first vows, was assigned to the community of Keur Montfort to teach Mathematics and French at the Saint-Montfort Technical Centre in Fass. At the end of this first year of religious life, he was sent to Collège Saint-Michel in October 1999 for training in accounting and management. There, in July 2001, he graduated with a Brevet de Technicien Supérieur in Accounting and Management.

Brothers of St. Gabriel

Joseph was then posted to Fatick as a member of the training team, keeping the registers at Collège du Sine and teaching a few hours of classes. He spent three (3) years there before being invited to move to Dakar to continue his studies.

From October 2004 to July 2007, while teaching mathematics and introduction to labour law at the center where he took his first steps in teaching, he continued his training in evening classes at the Ecole Supérieure Polytechnique de Dakar. He obtained, in turn, the accounting certificate, the legal certificate, and the economic certificate, which constitute a Higher Diploma in Accounting.

In July 2008, having just completed his fourth year of teaching at the CTA in Fass, he joined DP Audit et Conseil for a one-year internship. In July 2009 he was appointed headmaster of the Institution Saint-Louis Marie Grignion de Malika, which opened its junior cycle in October with two (2) classes: a 6th and a 5th. Two years later, in June 2011, he was appointed Provincial Bursar of the Brothers of Saint Gabriel. He then joined the Provincial House, where he will remain until 2019.

In September 2019, he was posted to the CTA community in Fass and resumed his studies at the ESP, this time for a master's degree in CCA (accounting, control, and auditing). In October 2020, he will be posted to Collège Saint-Pierre du Grand-Dakar as headmaster. He will stay for two (2) years, after which the congregation will hand over management of the college to the Archdiocese of Dakar. During this time, he will continue to serve as provincial bursar, finally leaving on 1 July 2022, after eleven (11) years of service.

Since October 2022, the community of Malika responsible for supporting the new economy in its work. He also gives catechism classes in the first and last years of secondary school, at the same time as taking evening classes, still at the ESP in Dakar.



rom May 20 to 21, 2023, Grignion de Montfort Association (AGMONT) of Spain organized a pilgrimage to Lourdes. It must be said in passing that this pilgrimage was the first since the end of the barriers of COVID 19.

Around 90 people participated in this pilgrimage. It was a personal, family and community faith journey, a meeting and sharing, a spiritual search. It goes without saying that Lourdes is a privileged place to renew one's spiritual strength in prayer; a place of renewal, of comfort, of inner healing. Lourdes is also an extension of the joy experienced by the pilgrims of Israel: "What joy when they said to me, we will go to the house of the Lord " (Ps 122:1). In short, it's a place of thanksgiving for the wonders of God through Mary, in Mary and with Mary.

Montfortian Gabrielite **Partners** Group de l'Espagne (AGMONT), by reviving the tradition of making a Montfortian pilgrimage each vear, allows its members and friends to enter into a communion of faith and charity, with people coming from all corners of the world, in the footsteps of Bernadette Soubirous

who had the privilege of welcoming the manifestations of the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary, in 1858, at the age of fourteen.

Lourdes, a journey of faith and charity lived with the Lord through Mary

Two buses were contracted for two groups. The first one left from Saint Gabriel College in Sant Adria and the second from Saint Gabriel College in Besós de Barcelona. Around 5:15 a.m., the departure to Lourdes began, in a spirit of prayer and fraternity. One could say that the pilgrims experienced Psalm 34, 9 which says: "taste and see how good the Lord is". One could easily read the joy of living fraternity, conviviality and friendship in a Montfortian spirit.

In Lourdes, all the pilgrims were lodged in the same hotel called PEYRAMALE. We can mention among others the Marian procession at 9:00 p.m.,

A short homily, precise and clear, but above all challenging. This was followed by the Way of the Cross, located on the hill of Espélugues, led by Brother Genaro Fresno. For those who were not able to make the ascent, they were offered another itinerary of the Way of the Cross, more suitable for their age, led by Brother Eugenio. Finally, these exercises of piety were concluded with the recitation of the rosary at the place called: « Across the Gave »

The Montfortian Gabrielite Partners Group and friends took the opportunity to give thanks to God, who allowed this trip to Lourdes to be realized, for the spiritual renewal, for the encounter with the Blessed Virgin Mary, who finally directs us to her Son Jesus Christ. he RIAM (International Meeting of Montfortian Associates) was a dream forgotten in the drawers of the three Central Administrations, which had been waiting for a long time to be realised. This decisive step had to be taken to deepen the journey of strengthening the Montfortian charismatic family. The need was now felt to bring together the lay associates of the three Montfortian congregations so that they could get to know each other, forge links and share experiences. In other words, the aim was to encourage greater collaboration and synergy between the three congregations and their respective movements of associates. In short, to make the associates feel part of one big family, the Montfortian family.

The project was 'pulled out of the drawer' in March 2022, at the annual meeting of the three Central Administrations in Rome. The idea was to offer a similar experience to the RISL (Rencontre Internationale Saint Laurent) which had taken place 10 years earlier, but this time on a global scale rather than just a European one. In order to monitor the implementation of this project more directly, the three ADCs delegated the councillors responsible for the partnership dossier: Sr. Pierrette Bwamba, FDLS, Fr Arnold Suhardi, SMM and Bro. Dionigi Taffarello, SG.

After deciding on the venue, the dates and the criteria for selecting the participants, we had to set up a committee in France to take charge of all the

organisational aspects of this meeting. We must all acknowledge that Providence was with us in putting together an extraordinary team, made up of lay associates and religious from the three Montfortian congregations. It is remarkable to note the generosity with which the members of the committee responded to the call to work on this project, and even more extraordinary to see their enthusiasm and dedication in bringing this arduous and complex international meeting to fruition. There was no shortage of challenges and difficulties. In order to face and overcome them, everyone gave the best of themselves with faith so that this beautiful and important project of the Montfortian family could become a reality.



International Meeting August 2023

After months of meetings and preparation, some 170 associates and religious from the three Montfortian congregations, coming from 36 different countries, met at Saint Laurent-sur-Sèvre from 7 to 12 August 2023 to spend a week in formation, getting to know each other and visiting some Montfortian places. Unfortunately, almost 30 other members were unable to attend due to the enormous difficulties encountered when applying for visas. The disappointment of all those, especially from Africa, who were unable to attend despite having done their utmost to obtain visas, was clear to see.





The theme of the meeting was: "Missionary disciples in the Montfortian family". The first day was devoted in particular to getting to know the programme for the week, giving the participants all the technical and organisational information they needed to make the most of the week, and getting to know each other through the testimonies of some associates from the three congregations. In the afternoon, Brother Jean-Claude Lavigne, OP, presented the theme "Synodality in the Montfortian family" and helped the participants to enter into the atmosphere of reflection of the week.



The second day was devoted to discovering the places where Montfort grew up, namely the houses where he was born in Montfort sur Meu and Iffendic, and the hermitage of Saint Lazare. The day ended with a celebration in the church of Cesson and a crossing of the famous bridge that Montfort crossed to go to Paris, while everyone was invited to see what they could give up to be more faithful to the example of Jesus.







The third day began with a talk by Father Marco Pasinato, SMM, on "Montfort and Baptism", followed by group work. In the afternoon, the participants, divided according to their congregation, met up with their Assistant Generals for a time of sharing and getting to know each other. Immediately afterwards, guided tours were given of the most important sites in Saint Laurent-sur-Sèvre. The day ended with a very moving and intense moment of prayer. On the second anniversary of the assassination of Father Olivier Maire, everyone gathered in the Basilica of Saint Louis-Marie de Montfort for a prayer vigil during which the many martyrs in the history of the three congregations were remembered. For our congregation, the 49 Spanish Brothers killed in 1936, the 7 Belgian Brothers massacred at Buta in the DRC in 1965 and Brother Joseph Douet murdered at Kataco in Guinea Conakry in April 2008 were presented.



On the fourth day, it was time to visit Poitiers, the cradle of the Montfortian family. Brother Maurice Hérault presented the theme "Lay people and Montfort in Poitiers", highlighting the important role played by many lay people in Montfort's mission and in the life of the Montfortian congregations.



The fifth day was dedicated to another very important place in the history of Montfort: the Calvary of Pontchâteau. The researcher André Martin presented the theme "Montfort and the involvement of lay people in Pontchâteau", describing the important role played by lay people in the construction of the Calvary and the various renovations that have taken place over the course of its history. In the afternoon, the new evangelisation project led by the three congregations on the site was presented. The aim is to make Pontchâteau a centre for evangelisation and the spreading of Montfortian spirituality. The visit ended with the celebration of the Way of the Cross, which took place indoors due to the rain.

The sixth and final day was marked by four important moments:

- the presentation of the theme "Saint Louis de Montfort and the Bible" by Sr Anne Marie David, FDLS;
- the intervention of Maria Jesús Ramos and Gemma Justo Medrano, associates of our Spanish province, who, in presenting the

- theme "Missionary disciples on the path of synodality", gave a testimony to the marvellous collaboration between laypeople and Brothers in Spain, especially in the school world;
- group work divided by continent to reflect on how to increase collaboration between the associates of the three congregations in the different continents:
- a festive evening, where everyone was able to share the culture and traditions of their own country, in a joyful and fraternal atmosphere.



At the end of the week, everyone gathered in the Basilica of St Louis-Marie Grignion for the send-off celebration presided over by the Bishop of Luçon, Mgr François Jacolin. It was an opportunity not only to thank God and our founders for this wonderful experience, but also to express, with great emotion and gratitude, our deepest thanks to all those who worked to make this project a reality:

- the organising committee made up of Mr Eric Joyeau (coordinator), Mr Claude Tignon, Ms Marie-Line Tignon, Ms Véronique Frinault, Ms Sylvie Abraham, Sr Marie Laure Paillet, FDLS, Sr Dorothée Harushimana Militant of the Blessed Virgin, Father Eric Manirakiza, SMM, Brothers Claude Marsaud, Maurice Hérault and Guy Bertrand, FSG;
- the interpreters: Daniel Busnel, SMM, and Brother Michel Mendy, FSG, Father Marco Pasinato, SMM, Brother Dionigi Taffarello, FSG;
- the many volunteers in Saint Laurent-sur-Sèvre, Poitiers, Montfort-sur-Meu, Cesson and Pontchâteau who offered their invaluable help in welcoming and accompanying the participants;

 the parish community of Saint Laurent-sur-Sèvre and the Collège Saint Gabriel et Saint Michel for their warm welcome and hospitality.

I can say that the objectives of the meeting were fully achieved thanks also to the active involvement of all the participants, aware of the great opportunity that was offered to them and of the important responsibility

of passing on what they had received in their place of mission. It is certain that another great step has been taken on the road to building the Montfortian Charismatic Family.

Working as a teacher in Chinon (France), he came to Rome several times during his school holidays. Brother René Guibert was inspired by the stamp designed by Jacques Combet to highlight Saint-Louis-Marie Grignion de Montfort and his influence. Until a couple of years ago, there was still Jacques Combet's Tricentenary stamp to the right of the fresco.

In 1990, Brother Jean Friant, Superior General, and his Council asked Bro. René Guibert to update the exhibition room. But the fresco was not touched. In the following updates in 2000 and 2012, the fresco was always left intact.



Brother Timoteo,
27 years old
Born in Urbel del Castillo (Burgos)

Another man of God. He partakes of religious knowledge and human and popular knowledge.

He was a lover of jokes, with a Cervantine maturity. At the same time he was a good teacher who was very effective in the school results.

He was brimming with intelligence and friendliness with all persons, but particularly with all his religious Brothers, very much appreciated for his manner and conversation that were always friendly and joyful. His secret, no doubt, was his great devotion to the Holy Virgin.

He had a special predilection and caring for juniors of Can Valls due to the fact that he used his summers to help the teachers of the juniors, relinquishing his vacation time, staying to help the students and at the same time lightening the load of those teachers that did not have vacation time.

While in San Adrián de Besós, he was arrested on the Bogatell Street when he accompanied his students to their houses after School. The police mistook him for a revolutionary. He was arrested and taken to a jail until the Superiors could help him and enable his release. He was joyful of having suffered something for Christ.

Lorenzo ORTEGA GARCÍA Brother Estanislao, Provincial, 37 years old Born in Atapuerca (Burgos)

He was a native of Burgos, noble and fine, full of fortitude and dignity, of an extraordinary simplicity and sensitivity. In his request for the perpetual vows he wrote: "I dare to promise to work with dedication...to be a real religious Gabrielite". The education and human preparation of Brother Estanislao was selective, from his Christian family to his Gabrielite education, cultural and competent.

He was Master of the Novices and later Provincial Superior, his appointment as the first Spaniard in this category coinciding with the establishment in 1935 of the autonomous Spanish Province. He has left us various writings and numerous letters from his time as Provincial addressed in particular to the Superior General and the General Assistants.

He had a an exquisite musical sensitivity, and was the director of the choir and a good organist. He was the spiritual soul of all the Spanish Brothers. A living testimony to all the Castilian virtues.

In the years 1935 and 1936 he had to visit all the schools to inform himself of the sad events and to encourage everyone to remain faithful to their vocation and religious ideal. A courageous and steadfast leader of the Martyred Brothers in the jail of San Elías.
